Our cities are changing but it is difficult to say whether it is taking a turn to the better or worse. Venice is already a deserted tourist town and gets more and more unlivable every day, even though it kind of keeps its charme...

Mestre is a city constantly changing with a lot of refurbishment and restoration works going on, although they don't contribute to attracting younger people. The young ones are increasingly fleeing towards the peripheries. Also for Marghera and the area around the factories there is allegedly a repeated modernisation process going on that is about to change this area into a super-modern inner city.

Best two action(s) of your group against racism and/or for the integration of minority groups in the past year/season:

1. Our continuous participation in the tournaments of our migrant communities who represent an important moment of integration – especially during this crisis – where migrants are looked at as root causes of the problems in our society.
2. In the past years, we've provided free tickets for migrants so that they could get into the ground. However, due to the missing relationship with the current board, this is not happening at the moment.

...we would celebrate with our people, with the boys of the group and with those, who deserved the promotion and who made sacrifice over sacrifice to follow the team everywhere. It's just four days until the end of the season at the moment and we're in the fight for promotion, so let's keep our fingers crossed!
